Hamilton (l. c), with Tilla, for which it is, at first sight, most readily mistaken, and other aquatic or semi-aquatic growths, with which it carpets the river-bottom to a very considerable depth. The leaves are strictly opposite, the petioles being, indeed, connate, and the seeds contain a copious albumen, which is wanting in Boragcm pruper. I have been unable to satisfy myself entirely as to the stivation, farther than that it appears to be imbricate, though in what sequence...
